<p><b>CONSTITUTION AMENDMENT # 1</b></p> <p>Shall the Tennessee Constitution be amended so that the period (.) at the end of Article XI, Section 5, of the Constitution of Tennessee be changed to a comma (,) and the following new language be added:</p> <p>except that the legislature may authorize a state lottery if the net proceeds of the lottery's revenues are allocated to provide financial assistance to citizens of this state to enable such citizens to attend post-secondary educational institutions located within this state. **CITY OF CHATTANOOGA  
MUNICIPAL ELECTION**

**ORDINANCE NO. 11305  
(Summary)**

Shall Ordinance No. 11305 to amend the Charter of the City of Chattanooga be approved so as to repeal the provisions of the Charter limiting the monetary amount of fines, inasmuch as the limitation is provided for by the Constitution of Tennessee?

**Certification of the Chief Financial Officer:**  
Inasmuch as the State Constitution already governs monetary limitations on fines, this measure has no financial impact on the City.

**ORDINANCE NO. 11306  
(Summary)**

Shall Ordinance No. 11306 to amend the Charter of the City of Chattanooga be approved so as to repeal the provision regarding the City building, owning and operating off-street parking facilities (Section 2.12 of the Charter)? Said Ordinance provides in pertinent part:

"That inasmuch as there is a shortage of downtown parking facilities, and it is more costly to the City to build such facilities using revenue bonds received under Section 2.12 of the Charter as opposed to general obligation bonds, the present Charter...is hereby amended by repealing Section 2.12."

Section 2.12 prohibits the City from owning, maintaining or operating off-street parking facilities except when located within an urban renewal project or when located and used in connection with a municipal facility or function. It further provides that to finance construction of such off-street parking facilities, only revenue bonds shall be issued.

**Certification of the Chief Financial Officer:**  
This measure could result in annual savings to the City in excess of \$50,000.

**ORDINANCE NO. 11307  
(Summary)**

Shall Ordinance No. 11307 to amend the present Charter provisions to provide for more efficient collection of delinquent taxes be approved? The City Council may set the rate of interest on delinquent taxes, not to exceed the legal rate. Distress Warrants to collect certain delinquent taxes can be returned before the General Sessions Court and other courts. When suit is filed, a penalty of ten percent (10%) is added to defray the cost of collection. Courts are authorized to divest title out of the prior owner and vest title in a purchaser at a delinquent tax sale. The City is not required to purchase delinquent property if there is an environmental risk. The Ordinance establishes certain procedures relating to suits to collect delinquent taxes including newspaper notice, consolidation of suits against one parcel of land, appointment and compensation of the delinquent tax attorney, and collection of other delinquent assessments and taxes in the same suit. The City Council may, by ordinance, change the procedures for the collection of delinquent taxes to conform to changes in state law.

**ORDINANCE NO. 11308  
(Summary)**

Shall Ordinance No. 11308 to amend the Charter of the City of Chattanooga be approved so as to amend the provision of the Charter requiring daily sessions of City Court, to instead require that sessions be held daily except for holidays and weekends. Said amendment changes Section 4.5 of the Charter by deleting the first sentence thereof which says:

"A session of said court shall be daily except Sunday."

and substitutes in lieu thereof the following:

"A session of said city court shall be held daily except for holidays and weekends."

**ORDINANCE NO. 11309  
(Summary)**

Shall Ordinance No. 11309 to amend the Charter of the City of Chattanooga be approved so as to repeal the Sections 12.6, 12.23, and 12.24 of the City Charter?

Section 12.6 requires that construction of public facilities must be submitted for recommendations to the City Planning Commission (which no longer exists) and that any changes in streets, or public grounds be similarly submitted.

Section 12.23 requires that in cities having a City Planning Commission it have hearings and make recommendations on district boundaries and regulations and publish notice of the hearings.

Section 12.24 permits changes in such regulations, restrictions and boundaries and provides for procedures to do so.

This measure has no financial impact on the City.

**ORDINANCE NO. 11310  
(Summary)**

Shall Ordinance No. 11310 to amend the Charter of the City of Chattanooga be approved so as to delete the specific monetary amounts set forth in Section 4.4 of the City Charter and permit the same to be set by ordinance. Said section now provides:

"In all cases tried in the city court of Chattanooga for the violation of ordinances of said city, fees shall be taxed, in each case tried, by the clerk of the city court as follows:

Issuing warrant or other original process.....	\$0.75
Judgement.....	0.75
Docketing.....	0.25
Continuance.....	0.25
Recognition bond.....	0.50
Appeal bond.....	0.75
Issuing subpoena for a single witness.....	0.50
Issuing subpoena for each add'l witness.....	0.10
Taxing cost.....	0.50
Mittimus to workhouse.....	0.25
Officer's cost, arrest.....	1.00
For each witness summoned.....	0.50
Continuance requiring officer's attendance.....	1.00"

**Certification of the Chief Financial Officer:**  
Inasmuch as the court costs being amended in the charter are antiquated, it is possible that higher revenues will be realized when court costs are set by future ordinances. An estimate of such increases is unknown at this time.
